CHAIR'S LETTER

Dear Shareholder

Annual General Meeting 2021

I am pleased to invite you to our second Annual General Meeting ("AGM"). The AGM will be held at on Tuesday, 18 May 2021, at 12:30 p.m. at Herbert Smith Freehills LLP, Exchange House, Primrose Street, EC2A 2EG.

Full details of the meeting and the resolutions that will be put to shareholders are set out in the enclosed Notice of Annual General Meeting.

US Solar Fund plc (the "Company") has published its Annual Report & Financial Statements for the year to 31 December 2020 (the "2020 Annual Report"). This is now available on the Company's website at <http://www.ussolarfund.co.uk> and a hard copy was posted to those shareholders who had specifically requested to receive a copy.

The 2021 AGM – Coronavirus (Covid-19)

Given the risks posed by the Covid-19 pandemic, if government guidance at the time of the AGM precludes unnecessary travel and gatherings of more than a very limited number (which, at the date of this notice, is expected to be the case), the Company will in all likelihood have to impose entry restrictions on shareholder attendance at the AGM. The Company's board of directors (the "Board") will continue to monitor Government guidance and will update shareholders on any changes to the below measures by way of an announcement to the London Stock Exchange and through the Company's website.

Proposed AGM Arrangements

The Company is required by law to hold an AGM within six months of our financial year end. Given the unprecedented circumstances, the Board will be moving forward with the AGM but has decided to put in place contingency arrangements that mean the AGM will not follow its usual format, as set out below:

- the AGM will be at Herbert Smith Freehills LLP, Exchange House, Primrose Street, EC2A 2EG;
- the Company is making the necessary arrangements to ensure that the AGM is quorate;
- there is likely to be restrictions on attendance at the meeting if this is necessary due to Government restrictions on travel and gatherings in place at the time of the AGM. Accordingly, you are strongly encouraged to vote on the resolutions to be proposed at the AGM in advance by form of proxy;
- Shareholders are invited to view online (although not be formally present at) proceedings live;
- Shareholders will be able to submit questions in advance of the AGM and answers will be published on the Company's website in advance of the AGM. The Chair of the AGM will also endeavour to address key themes arising out of these at the meeting;
- the votes on the resolutions to be proposed at the AGM will be conducted by poll; and
- the results of the proxy votes will be published immediately following the conclusion of the AGM by way of a stock exchange announcement and on the Company's website.

Engagement with Shareholders and online participation at the AGM

The Board recognises that the AGM provides an important opportunity to engage with Shareholders and that, notwithstanding the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic, it is important to maintain that. Accordingly, a presentation from the Investment Manager will be available on the Company's website by 10 May and Shareholders are encouraged to submit questions in advance of the AGM, by 5:00 p.m. on 14 May. To the extent that it is appropriate to do so, we will respond to them in a Q&A which will be posted on our website, in advance of the AGM. The AGM itself will be webcast so that shareholders may follow the proceedings online, and listen to the Chair's address of the key themes arising out of such questions received in advance of the AGM, although Shareholders will not be able to speak or vote at the AGM and will not be counted in the quorum.

If you would like to ask a question, or request a link to the webcast, please email the Company's Company Secretary at USSolarFund-CompanySecretary@jtcgroup.com by close of business on Friday, 14 May 2021. Please ensure that your email has the subject heading 'USF AGM' and that your name and Shareholder reference number are included. Please note that the Investment Manager will not be in attendance at the AGM as they are located in the US and Australia.

Action to be taken by shareholders

In order to ensure that your votes are registered in the likely event that attendance at the AGM is not possible or restricted, shareholders are strongly advised to vote on the resolutions to be proposed at the AGM in advance. To do this, please register your proxy vote electronically by accessing our Registrar's website www.investorcentre.co.uk/eproxy, using control number 917059. Alternatively, the form of proxy accompanying this document may be completed and returned, in accordance with the instructions printed on it, to the Company's registrars at Computershare Investor Services PLC at The Pavilions, Bridgwater Road, Bristol BS99 6ZY as soon as possible, but in any event it must be received by no later than 12:30p.m. on Friday, 14 May 2021.

Commentary on the resolutions

Resolution 1: Receive the Annual Report and Financial Statements

The Companies Act 2006 (the "Companies Act") requires the directors of a public company to lay before the company in general meeting copies of the annual report, directors' report and its auditor's report in respect of each financial year. These are contained in the Company's annual report and financial statements for the year to 31 December 2020 (the "2020 Annual Report"). Accordingly, a resolution to receive the 2020 Annual Report is included as an ordinary resolution. Shareholders are invited to submit any questions on the 2020 Annual Report in advance of the AGM. To the extent that it is appropriate to do so, we will respond to them in a Q&A which will be posted on our website, in advance of the AGM and the Chair will also endeavour to address key themes arising out of these at the meeting

Resolution 2: Approve the directors' remuneration report

The directors' remuneration report can be found on pages 63 to 66 of the 2020 Annual Report and is subject to an advisory vote by Shareholders, which is proposed as an ordinary resolution. It details the payments that have been made to Directors during the year, in accordance with the current remuneration policy.

Resolutions 3 and 4: Appointment of auditors and auditors' remuneration

Resolution 3 relates to the appointment of Deloitte LLP as the Company's auditors to hold office until the conclusion of the Company's next annual general meeting. This resolution is recommended by the Company's audit committee and endorsed by the Board. Accordingly, it is proposed, as an ordinary resolution, to appoint Deloitte LLP as the Company's auditors. Similarly, resolution 4 authorises the Directors, upon recommendation from the Company's Audit Committee, to fix the auditors' remuneration.

The Directors, having regard to the audit committee's recommendation, consider that the level of consultancy related non-audit fees to audit fees undertaken by Deloitte LLP is appropriate for the advisory work required to be undertaken for the year to 31 December 2020 and that these do not create a conflict of interest on the part of the independent auditor.

Resolutions 5 to 8: Election of directors

The Company's articles of association specify that any director who has been appointed by the Board of directors during the year shall hold office only until the next annual general meeting of the Company. Each of the existing Directors will retire from office with effect from the conclusion of the AGM and will stand for re-election by the Shareholders.

Brief biographies of each member of the Board standing for election (or re-election) can be found on page 36 of the 2020 Annual Report.

The Directors believe that the Board has an appropriate balance of skills, experience, independence and knowledge of the Company and the sector in which it operates to enable it to provide effective strategic leadership and proper guidance of the Company. The Board confirms that, following the evaluation process set out in the Corporate Governance Report on page 46, the performance of each of the Directors is, and continues to be, effective and demonstrates commitment to the role. The Board believes, therefore, that it is in the interests of shareholders that Thomas Plagemann be elected and Gill Nott, Rachael Nutter and Jamie Richards be re-elected.

Resolution 9: Approval of the dividend policy

Resolution 9 concerns the approval of the Company's dividend policy which is to pay interim quarterly dividends to the Ordinary Shareholders, in US Dollars.

Resolution 10: Market purchase of own shares

This resolution seeks authority for the Company to make market purchases of its own ordinary shares and is proposed as special resolution. If passed, the resolution gives authority for the Company to purchase up to 30,008,834 of its ordinary shares, or, if less, 14.99 per cent of the Company's issued ordinary share capital immediately prior to the passing of this resolution (excluding treasury shares).

The resolution specifies the minimum and maximum prices which may be paid for any ordinary shares purchased under this authority. The authority will expire on the earlier of 15 months from the passing of the resolution and the Company's next annual general meeting.

The directors do not currently have any intention of exercising the authority granted by this resolution. The directors will only exercise the authority to purchase ordinary shares where they consider that such purchases will be in the best interests of Shareholders generally and will result in an increase in earnings per ordinary share.

The Company may either cancel any shares it purchases under this authority or transfer them into treasury (and subsequently sell or transfer them out of treasury or cancel them). The directors currently intend to cancel all shares purchased under this authority.

The Company does not have any options or outstanding share warrants.

Resolution 11: Notice period for general meetings

Resolution 11 is to be proposed as a special resolution to allow the Company to hold general meetings (other than annual general meetings) on at least 14 days' notice.

If approved, the resolution will be effective until the end of the Company's next annual general meeting. The Board will consider on a case by case basis whether the use of the flexibility offered by the shorter notice period is merited, taking into account the circumstances, including whether the business of the meeting is time sensitive.

Your Directors are of the opinion that all resolutions which are to be proposed at the AGM are in the best interests of the Company and its shareholders and therefore unanimously recommend that you vote in favour of the resolutions as they intend to do in respect of any shares in respect of which they have voting control.

 - (b) the minimum price (excluding expenses) which may be paid for each Ordinary Share or is US\$0.01;
 - (c) the maximum price (excluding expenses) which may be paid for each Ordinary Share is the higher of:
 - i. 105% of the average market value of an Ordinary Share in the Company for the five business days prior to the day the purchase is made; and
 - ii. the higher of the last independent trade and the highest current independent bid on the London Stock Exchange; and
 - (d) Unless previously varied, revoked or renewed, shall come to an end at the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting of the Company next following the passing of this resolution or on the expiry of 15 months from the passing of the resolution, whichever is the earlier.

NOTES

(a) Any member of the Company entitled to attend and vote at the Annual General Meeting is also entitled to appoint one or more proxies to attend, speak and vote instead of that member, subject to any Government restrictions on travel or gatherings in place at the time of the AGM. A member may appoint more than one proxy in relation to the Annual General Meeting provided that each proxy is appointed to exercise the rights attached to a different share or shares held by that member. A proxy may demand, or join in demanding, a poll. A proxy need not be a member of the Company but must attend the Annual General Meeting in order to represent his appointor. A member entitled to attend and vote at the Annual General Meeting may appoint the Chair or another person as his proxy although the Chair will not speak for the member. A member who wishes his proxy to speak for him should appoint his own choice of proxy (not the Chair) and give instructions directly to that person. If you are not a member of the Company but you have been nominated by a member of the Company to enjoy information rights, you do not have a right to appoint any proxies under the procedures set out in these Notes. Please read Note (h) below. Under section 319A of the Act, the Company must answer any question a member asks relating to the business being dealt with at the Annual General Meeting unless:

- answering the question would interfere unduly with the preparation for the Annual General Meeting or involve the disclosure of confidential information;
- the answer has already been given on a website in the form of an answer to a question; or
- it is undesirable in the interests of the Company or the good order of the Annual General Meeting that the question be answered.

(b) To be valid, a Form of Proxy and (if required) the Power of Attorney or other written authority, if any, under which it is signed or an office or notarially certified copy or a copy certified in accordance with the Powers of Attorney Act 1971 of such power and written authority, must be delivered to the Company's registrars Computershare Investor Services PLC, The Pavilions, Bridgwater Road, Bristol BS99 6ZY, not less than 48 hours (excluding weekends and public holidays) before the time appointed for holding the Annual General Meeting or adjourned meeting at which the person named in the Form of Proxy proposes to vote. In the case of a poll taken more than 48 hours (excluding weekends and public holidays) after it is demanded, the document(s) must be delivered as aforesaid not less than 24 hours (excluding weekends and public holidays) before the time appointed for taking the poll, or where the poll is taken not more than 48 hours (excluding weekends and public holidays) after it was demanded, be delivered at the meeting at which the demand is made.

In order to revoke a proxy instruction a member will need to inform the Company by sending a signed hard copy notice clearly stating the intention to revoke the proxy appointment to the Company's registrars, Computershare Investor Services PLC, The Pavilions, Bridgwater Road, Bristol BS99 6ZY. In the case of a member which is a company, the revocation notice must be executed under its common seal or signed on its behalf by an officer of the company or an attorney for the company. Any power of attorney or any other authority under which the revocation notice is signed (or a duly certified copy of such power or authority) must be included with the revocation notice.

The revocation notice must be received by 12:30 p.m. on 14 May 2021, 48 hours (excluding weekends and bank holidays) before the Annual General Meeting or the holding of a poll subsequently thereto. If a member attempts to revoke his or her proxy appointment but the revocation is received after the time specified then, subject to Note (d) directly below, the proxy appointment will remain valid.

In order for a proxy appointment or instruction made using the CREST service to be valid, the appropriate CREST

message (CREST Proxy Instruction) must be properly authenticated in accordance with Euroclear UK & Ireland Limited's (Euroclear UK & Ireland) specifications and must contain the information required for such instructions, as described in the CREST manual. The message, regardless of whether it constitutes the appointment of a proxy or an amendment to the instruction given to a previously appointed proxy must, in order to be valid, be transmitted so as to be received by the issuer's agent Computershare Investor Services PLC (under CREST ID number 3RA50), no later than 12.30 p.m. on 14 May 2021, or by not later than 2 business days prior to the time appointed for the holding of any adjourned meeting. Normal system timings and limitations will therefore apply in relation to the input of CREST Proxy Instructions. It is the responsibility of the CREST member concerned (or, if the CREST member is a CREST personal member or sponsored member or has appointed a voting service provider(s) to procure that his CREST sponsor or voting service provider(s) take(s) such action as shall be necessary to ensure that a message is transmitted by the CREST system by any particular time. In this connection, CREST members and, where applicable, their CREST sponsors or voting service provider(s) are referred, in particular, to those sections of the CREST manual concerning practical limitations of the CREST system and timings. The Group may treat as invalid a CREST Proxy Instruction in the circumstances set out in Regulation 35(5)(a) of the Uncertificated Securities Regulations 2001.

- (d) Pursuant to Regulation 41 of the Uncertificated Securities Regulations 2001, the Company has specified that only those holders of the Company's shares registered on the Register of Members of the Company as at close of business on 14 May 2021 or, in the event that the Annual General Meeting is adjourned, on the Register of Members 48 hours before the time of any adjourned meeting, shall be entitled to attend and vote at the said Annual General Meeting in respect of such shares registered in their name at the relevant time, subject to any Government restrictions on travel or gatherings in place at the time of the AGM. Changes to entries on the Register of Members after close of business on 14 May 2021 or, in the event that the Annual General Meeting is adjourned, on the Register of Members less than 48 hours before the time of any adjourned meeting, shall be disregarded in determining the right of any person to attend and vote at the Annual General Meeting.
- (e) As at 19 April 2021, the Company's issued share capital comprised 200,192,361 Ordinary Shares and the total number of voting rights in the Company were 200,192,361. Information regarding the number of Shares and voting rights may be obtained from the website, at <http://www.ussolarfund.co.uk>.
- (f) If you are a person who has been nominated under section 146 of the Act to enjoy information rights ("Nominated Person"):
- You may have a right under an agreement between you and the member of the Company who has nominated you to have information rights ("Relevant Member") to be appointed or to have someone else appointed as a proxy for the Annual General Meeting;
 - If you either do not have such a right or if you have such a right but do not wish to exercise it, you may have a right under an agreement between you and the Relevant Member to give instructions to the Relevant Member as to the exercise of voting rights; and
 - Your main point of contact in terms of your investment in the Company remains the Relevant Member (or, perhaps your custodian or broker) and you should continue to contact them (and not the Company) regarding any changes or queries relating to your personal details and your interest in the Company (including any administrative matters). The only exception to this is where the Company expressly requests a response from you.
- (g) A corporation which is a member can appoint one or more corporate representatives who may exercise, on its behalf, all its powers as a member provided that no more than one corporate representative exercises powers over the same share.
- (h) A vote withheld is not a vote in law, which means that the vote will not be counted in the calculation of votes for or against the resolution. If no voting indication is given, the proxy will vote or abstain from voting at his or

her discretion. The proxy will vote (or abstain from voting) as he or she thinks fit in relation to any other matter which is put before the Annual General Meeting.

- (i) Except as provided above, members who have general queries about the Annual General Meeting should write to the Chair at the registered office set out above.
- (j) Members may not use any electronic address provided either in this notice of Annual General Meeting, or any related documents (including the Chair's letter and Form of Proxy), to communicate with the Company for any purposes other than those expressly stated.
- (k) Under section 338 of the Act, members meeting the threshold requirements set out in that section have the right to require the Company to give notice of a resolution which may properly be moved at the AGM. Any such request, which must comply with s.338(4) of the Act, must be received by the Company no later than six weeks before the date fixed for the AGM.
- (l) Under section 338A of the Act, members meeting the threshold requirements set out in that section have the right to require the Company to include a matter (other than a proposed resolution) in the business to be dealt with at the AGM. Any such request, which must comply with s.338A(3) of the Act, must be received by the Company no later than six weeks before the date fixed for the AGM.
